

Our prayers are with the people of south Texas and the millions of residents of the fifty-eight counties effected by Hurricane Harvey. Our prayers are with the victims of the flood water, the thousands of rescue workers, the family and friends around the world who still have not made contact with their people in Texas and don't know their location or well-being. Our prayers are with the hearts of people around the world who want to help and are looking for opportunities to minister. People's lives have been traumatized and tragically changed forever, and we pray for Almighty God to intervene though faithful and willing people who can bring relief and renewal to broken and shattered lives.

How do we respond? Pray specifically for victims and rescue workers. Also, our congregation is in partnership with relief organizations including One Great Hour of Sharing and American Baptist Home Mission Society. Opportunities will become available in the coming weeks to respond through disaster relief mission opportunities. What I learned from Hurricane Katrina is that once the storm passes, and state and national officials account for victims and begin assessing damage, a multitude of agencies will volunteer to begin the rebuilding process. For now, pray fervently for our neighbors, for strength and fortitude for people searching and rescuing, and for a safe sanctuary for people until they can return home.

We are a faithful congregation of people who respond to the needs of people in crisis. Sometimes it is ongoing crisis that requires ongoing support and ministry. Certainly we have seen this in the housing and job shortages and increase of homelessness in Massachusetts. We respond. Also, we know personal crisis effect members of our congregation, and we respond. We pray for guidance of the Holy Spirit to direct our energy and stewardship of resources as we feel deeply for the needs of so many in crisis and devastation around the world. May God grant relief to so many displaced and suffering in the world, and wisdom to our hearts as we pray for a response that reflects our Christian faith.



The Stewardship of All Creation: Completing last year's stewardship campaign, the church now has a **compost bin**. It sits on the back side of the church near the children's room windows. Composting is a simple way to add nutrient-rich humus which fuels plant growth and restores vitality to depleted soil. It's also free, easy to make and good for the environment. We are currently composting fruit and vegetable scraps, coffee grounds, grass clippings, and leaves. Composting benefits creation by: recycling kitchen and yard waste, reducing landfill waste, and introducing beneficial organisms into the soil.

Children's Church is comprised of three separate activities (based on age) for children who come downstairs after the Time with the Children.


Nursery Care is provided for infants through children age 3. Two adults are with children as they play and interact in the Nursery.

Joyful Learning is for children age 4 through those in first grade. They meet in Reilly Hall. A typical Sunday starts with a snack, followed by a story, and then either a craft or



game. The first Sunday of the month is movie day when children enjoy an age appropriate movie and popcorn. Volunteers supervise the children on a rotating basis.

Library 4 also returns on September 10. "Library 4" welcomes any children in grades 2,3,4 or 5 to come down to Jefferson Hall, following the Children's Moment at the Sunday morning worship service, starting on Rally Day, September 10th. Mrs. Ross and Mrs. Wakeman will read Biblical, seasonal and inspirational stories to them each week, with some kind of pencil fun. Sometimes they send messages to our shut-ins. They now have over 350 books in their library. New ones this fall include "Our Loving God", "Found (Psalm 23)", and "Samuel, the Boy who listened".
