Temporary Shepherd February is an interesting and unique month. It is the shortest by at least two days and contains one federal holiday, two cultural ones, and sometimes a religious one, Ash Wednesday (in March this year).



My friends who struggle with depression find February to be extra challenging. The festivities and family gatherings of the Christmas season are over, the days are still pretty dark, and spring buds haven't even thought of peeking up through the frozen ground. (As I look out at my perennial garden, it's hard to believe that there are lovely blossoms resting under the snow, though only 3-4 inches at this writing.)

We are well aware that February is Heart Month and Black History Month. But did you know it was also Great American Pie Month, National Bird Feeding Month, National Cherry Month, and National Grapefruit Month?

In addition to Groundhog Day and Valentine's Day, other "cultural" holidays in February are Bubble Gum Day, Eat Ice Cream for Breakfast Day (I could get behind that), Stuffed Mushroom Day, Thank a Mailman Day, Send a Card to a Friend Day, Boy and Girl Scout Days, Kite Flying Day, Clean Out Your Computer Day, Random Acts of Kindness Day, National Chocolate Mint Day (yum), Love Your Pet Day, and about 50 other special and frivolous days. I guess someone thought February needed more occasions to celebrate since it is dark and short.

I don't mind winter, but I don't like the early dark. I don't get depressed, but I do get restless. This year has been different as I struggle with how to live without my sister. She and I were alike in many ways, and we both looked forward to garden season every year. So many things remind me of her, and almost every day I think to call her about something. I know that all of this is normal grieving stuff, and I think I'm making progress, whatever that means. Once again I thank you for your patience as I navigate this road and look for ways to honor her in my life.

The weeks before Lent — and Lent itself — provide the opportunity to discover new ways to make it through the bleakness of winter. Measured by the church year, the days go by fast, and the baby Jesus is growing up. He is teaching and preaching and healing the sick. Soon he will find himself in big trouble with the authorities — and we know the rest of the story.

Telling this story in whatever ways we can, to whomever we can, is one of the commissions of the church. Discovering new ways to do this, exploring the meaning of life together as a congregation, and focusing on how to move forward from here all come out of this commission. In this short, unique, challenging, cold, crazy month of February, I look forward to joining you in this.


200 Years of The First Baptist Church in Framingham

Did you know that people began worshiping in our building at 1013 Worcester Road almost 200 years ago? The Executive Council is talking about commemorating the occasion with special celebrations. If you have ideas on ways to do that or would like to be part of the fun, please talk to any council member.

Here are some excerpts from our history timeline:

November 17, 1825: The cornerstone for the church building was laid with Masonic rites. Only a rough cellar was finished under the 54' x 64' building; the back was open so that horses could be driven in and hitched. Box pews were sold to cover the cost of building. Two heating stoves were installed — an unusual luxury in those days. Total cost of the building, furnishings, and land was about \$9,000.

May 3, 1826: The Framingham church became a distinct body with 119 members when a council convened and voted "to constitute the brethren and sisters of Framingham as a distinct body and church of our Lord Jesus Christ in Framingham." The Reverend Charles Train became the pastor.



A Special Valentine


I'd like to hang a Valentine upon the world's front door, With hearts of love and peace entwined, to last forever more.
