## From Your Temporary Shepherd

Some of you know that I lost my oldest sister, my lifelong best friend, right before Christmas. Then last week I lost another dear friend of 42 years. We met at CYC in Maine in 1983, worked there together for 30 years, and remained friends ever since.



Both of these relationships blessed me in so many ways for decades, and it's difficult to imagine the world, and my life, without them. I also have friends who are struggling this year with life-threatening illnesses. I realize that these things happen more as we get older, but it's still hard to take.

That's one reason I rejoice in this season, as we travel the road on our way to Easter. Jesus' resurrection is vivid testimony that death is not the end of our lives. I know that my sister and my

friend are alive in God's kingdom — as whole and wonderful as they ever were on earth. I love to picture my sister, who spent half of her life in a wheelchair, walking and running and dancing with her husband.

Easter, like Christmas, has pretty much been taken over by the secular world. Folks who never darken the door of a church observe Easter; those who do not believe in Jesus observe Easter. Bunnies and eggs and new clothes and Easter baskets are the order of the day. But Christ's people celebrate the *real* story, for it is the very foundation of our faith. Without the resurrection, there is no Christian story. Without the triumph over death, there is no eternal life. Without the living Christ, there is no Good News!

I invite each of you to celebrate the Easter season with your First Baptist family this year. All of it — the Palm Sunday parade, the sadness and betrayal of Maundy Thursday, the cruelty of the crucifixion, and then the amazing joy of the resurrection. We cannot fully grasp the meaning of Easter, nor should we expect to, if we do not follow the cross through the *Via Delorosa*, the Way of Sorrows.

The events surrounding Easter are a perfect opportunity to invite a friend to join you in honoring this holy season. And we know that our loved ones who have gone on before us will join us in this celebration.

I look forward to spending Holy Week and Easter with you all!

#### **Executive Council News**

Executive Council met via Zoom on March 11. Here are highlights of the meeting:

- General fund balance: \$14,202.95; Rental property balance: \$21,373.08
- The Robert and Dorothy Phillips Account has been created at Fidelity.
- The church treasurer will make a recommendation about online giving (either Venmo or Tithely) to the A&F board by the April 2025 meeting.
- Deacons Fund Balance is \$1,355.97. The fund was recently used to purchase \$200 in food gift cards.
- We will take the World Mission offering in May. Kelly Rutherford will coordinate it.
- The Food Wagon has been refurbished and moved to the front of the sanctuary. Bridget Mboowa will facilitate donations.
- We will take a congregational picture after Easter Sunday worship.
- Members discussed our practice of putting videos of worship services on YouTube:
  - o We will stop recording the time of prayers for celebrations and concerns.
  - o A disclaimer will go in the bulletin that we record the services and put them on YouTube.
  - o Parents will be asked to sign a release at the beginning of the Sunday School year.
- The Pastoral Search Committee has completed the church profile, and it has been reviewed by Pastor Jerrie. Jay will submit it to TABCOM and schedule a meeting.
- Transition Team (Francesca Cerutti-Harris, Naomi Stanley, Pastor Jerrie) talked about having a discussion-style worship service, tentatively set as brunch in Reilly Hall on April 27 (Deacons need to approve). It would be a short worship service followed by discussion as we eat together. Those who normally attend on Zoom would be paired with an in-person attendee and participate that way.

The next Executive Council meeting is Tuesday, April 8, at 7:00 p.m. via Zoom. Members of Executive Council are Linda Devine, Kathie Zeman, Jay Reilly, Al Harrington, Francesca Cerutti-Harris, Naomi Stanley, Judy Llewellyn, Diane Halbert, and Pastor Jerrie.

## **Active Bystander Training**
