

Carolyn Reilly and I were talking over Christmas, and she shared stories of people who have faithfully carried out responsibilities through the years. I am mesmerized by her stories, as well as the stories of others, who do not want the adoration shared for so many to be forgotten. Out of these conversations came an idea. Once each

year we will read a memorial honor roll in the worship service, and print the names of people we want to remember in our bulletin. I discussed this with the Executive Council and we settled on May 20 as the Sunday to publish and read the names. I am asking you to submit a name or names, the dates of your person's life, and one or two sentences why this person has made a difference to you. I will provide note cards each Sunday on the podium under the projection screen and I will collect the cards through the winter and spring. If you have any questions, please see me or a member of the Executive Council for more details.

Also, I want to extend the invitation to you to participate in our **Ash Wednesday Service**. The service will be held on Wednesday, February 22, at 7 pm in Reilly Hall. The service will last about thirty minutes, and consist of hymns, scripture, music by the choir, and a guided meditation that will include ashes placed on the forehead of those wishing to participate. Ash Wednesday is a Christian service marking the beginning of Lent. The spirit of the service is to bring renewal to our spiritual life as we prepare our souls for the transforming season of Lent. I have both led and attended many Ash Wednesday services in my Christian life and have always experienced the service as uplifting and hopeful. The Executive Council shared with me that this will be a new experience at First Baptist. Therefore, I encourage your questions, thoughts, and most of all your attendance. May God bless you in your spirit this new year.

ADONIRAM JUDSON 200th

200 years ago Adoniram and Ann (Hasseltine) Judson sailed as missionaries to Burma. They were commissioned as Congregational Missionaries by the Tabernacle Church in Salem, Massachusetts on February 6, 1812, and departed Salem on February 20, 1812. On their half year journey, after studying the biblical meaning of immersion, they converted to Baptist beliefs and sought to be re-commissioned as Baptist Missionaries. Their request forced the loosely bonded fellowship of independent Baptist churches to form a Baptist Missionary Society in order to financially support the Judsons. Thus Adoniram and Ann became the first foreign missionaries of what was to become our denomination, <u>American Baptist Churches - USA</u>. Here are some of the many special events scheduled to celebrate the 200th anniversary of the Judson sailing.

Sunday, February 5 - Judson Ordination and Commissioning Commemoration at the Tabernacle UCC Church in Salem. Worship will be at 10:00 a.m. with Rev. Liz Walker, former TV news reporter, preaching. A special Judson Program will be held from 1:00 to 3:00 p.m.

Saturday, February 18 - Judson Heritage Bus Tour. 10:00 am to 3:00 pm to and from the First Baptist Church in Malden, MA. Reservations are \$15 and must be made by February 10th.


